





Code of Conduct

- 1. Students are answerable to the Principal and the Staff for their conduct both on and off the premises of the Institution.
- 2. Regular attendance and punctuality are a must. Absence often means missing out on interesting and important activities. This act is reprimanded.
- 3. Whole-hearted cooperation is required especially in dealing with the Staff and students of the practicing School as they are our co-operators in the task of training the teachers.
- 4. Participation in college activities is highly esteemed as it helps develop latent talents.
- 5. Indiscipline and unbecoming conduct will be considered sufficient reason for the rustication of a student.
- 6. Any student who is persistently or repeatedly or willfully being mischievous or is guilty of malpractice in connection with the examination or has committed any act of serious indiscipline or misbehavior or who, in the opinion of the principal has adverse influence on his fellow students, may be expelled permanently or removed from the roll for a specified period by the Head of the Institution.
- 7. If the Principal is satisfied that the continuance of a student in the Institution is undesirable in the interest of the Institution, or that the student is not likely to profit by the training, she may remove the name of the student without assigning him/her any reason for the same.
- 8. Students should scrupulously follow the instructions and notices of the University which will be communicated to them from time to time.
- 9. Students are expected to take proper care of the college property and co-operate with the college authorities in keeping the premises neat and tidy.
- 10. Smoking and eating paan is strictly prohibited in any part of the college building.
- 11. Students must not do anything inside or outside the college that will in any way interfere with its orderly administration, discipline, and smooth working.
- 12. Matters not covered by the above rules will rest at the absolute discretion of the principal.

Infrastructure



1. CLASSROOMS:

We own State of the art Classrooms for curriculum transactions which are complete with comfortable seating arrangements for our learners. We have an airy, well ventilated, and calm class ambience to aid maximum effectiveness from class proceedings. The LCD projector and the screen are well maintained to further enhance the teaching learning of our learners. The walls of our classrooms are adorned with various teaching learning resources which help in the quick acquisition of knowledge and provide a congenial and conducive area for healthy learning.



2. IT LABORATORY:

The institution shares the 2 IT laboratories on the 2nd and 4th floors of the campus with approximately 147 working computers having internet connections and LAN facilities which is available to all students of the campus for academic related work. Printout facilitates are also available to teachers of the campus.

3. GYMNKHANA:

The institution houses a well-equipped gymnasium for the physical and mental wellness of the learners. This is open to our faculty and students for their use. There are also indoor sports facilities for our learners in this gym.





4. SPORTS GROUND:

To organise various outdoor sports and national festival celebrations, the institution boasts of a sprawling outdoor sports ground. Various Collegiate and inter collegiate events and other training facilities pertaining to sports are organised on this venue.



5. SANITATION AND RESTROOM:

The institution has clean washrooms for the male and female students and faculty of the campus. The support staff ensure that these are kept spic n span for use by constantly cleaning the area. Students and faculty are trained to use water resources in a conserving manner to obliterate wastage of resources. A common room for girls is also present in the campus to special requirements of our female students. There is also facility of sanitary napkins for female staff and students available in third floor of the campus.

6. CANTEEN:

A hygienic and pocket friendly canteen meets the food requirements of our campus. Beverages like tea, coffee, soft drinks, buttermilk etc snacks such as Wada pav, samosas, upma, poha, idli etc and lunch menu comprising dal rice, Chinese food items, etc are served to students at competitive rates.



7. LIBRARY:

A well-stocked and updated library housing thousands of books, magazines, references, and manuals are available for the faculty and students of the institution through a well- oiled system of issuing books. Students are always welcome at the library, and librarians encourage them to read there.





8. SEMINAR HALL:

A 200-seater air conditioned and technology driven auditorium is gifted to the institution wherein various sister institutions of the campus conduct seminars, conferences, symposia, convocation, ceremonies, or just expert talks for the learners.



9. HOSTEL FACILITY:-

Healthy and Hygienic food for breakfast and dinner is available. Fresh and clean environment is ensured. It is located in the close vicinity of Oriental College Campus, Sanpada. The hostel is Fully furnished for comfortable living. it is under CCTV Surveillance 24*7 with attentive security personnel. It has high speed Wi-Fi facility as well. It can accommodate 210 students, with separate wings for boys and girls.



9. SANPADA RAILWAY STATION:

Our institution is just 5 minutes' walk outside the Sanpada Railway station on the West. This resource is put to use often, while our students conduct street plays on various socially relevant themes as part of their course requirements. The hustle and bustle of people at the station ensures a ready and sufficient audience for the conduct of such street plays.



Library Rules



- 1. Bonafide students of the college can only take benefit of the library.
- 2. Silence shall be strictly observed in the library.
- 3. Spitting, smoking, eating, drinking (tea, coffee etc.) or talking is strictly prohibited inside library.
- 4. No students shall be allowed to enter the library without a proper identity card.
- 5. Only one book or question paper set will be issued, but can be referred to in the library.
- 6. No reference book or reports or periodicals will be issued, but can be referred in the library.
- 7. One theory book can be issued to a student at a time.
- 8. No students shall damage any book, manuscript, records, or any other library material by tearing the pages etc. These damages to the books should be scrupulously avoided.
- 9. The borrower will be required to pay full current market price of any book lost or damaged. The cost payable for the books that are out of print will be determined by the principal.
- 10. The students are to see that no pages are missing, and check all the books at the time of borrowing. If any pages are missing the librarian should be informed. The librarian shall bring to the notice of principal of such reports.
- 11. Librarian has power to call back issued book/books from the library at any point of time, when it is needed.
- 12. Student should sign in & out time in attendance register when they enter /exit the library.
- 13. Library will be open from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm except Sunday & public holidays.
- 14. Cell phone is strictly prohibited inside the library.
- 15. A fine of Rs. 5/- per day will be charged in case of delay in returning the books. After three days the penalty amount will be Rs. 10/- per day.
- 16. Student must handle library books carefully. In case of any damage of books a disciplinary action will be taken against that student.
- 17. Since the library has storage space, students are requested to leave their bags in this area.
