

Sanitation and Rest




INFRASTRUCTURE CLASSROOMS

SEMESTER III ORIENTATION PROGRAM 29TH AUGUST, 2024




The Semester 3 Orientation at OCE was conducted on 29th August to welcome students into the new academic term.







TECH SAVVY WORKSHOP



Speaking Up: My First Experience with Public Speaking still remember the hush that fell over the auditorium the moment I began to speak. It was thefirst time I ever held a mic in my hand—back in the 9th standard during our school's elocution competition. As I stood there, the script slightly crumpled in my hand, something unexpectedhappened. Instead of panic, I felt a sudden calm. The silence in the room, the attentive eyes of the audience, and the gentle echo of my voice through the mic—it all felt strangely right. Thatwas the moment I discovered something about myself: I loved public speaking. Growing up in the city, I had access to good schools and opportunities, but like many students, Ihad always assumed that being good at something meant being naturally gifted. From then on, I began volunteering forassemblies, debates, and any chance I got to speak in front of an audience. It wasn't aboutshowing of—it was about sharing something, connecting with people, and growing more confident with each experience. Now, as I pursue my Master's in English Literature, I often look back at that moment in 9thgrade as the starting point of a journey. I find myself surrounded by articulate, fluent speakers, and while it can sometimes feel intimidating, the voice inside me—the one that first found itsstrength on that school stage—reminds me that I belong here too. I'm not starting from scratch; I'm building on a foundation I laid years ago. I continue to refine my skills. I read aloud to improve my intonation and pronunciation. I listen topodcasts and speeches, expand my vocabulary, and challenge myself to speak up inclass—even when self-doubt creeps in. And it's paying of. Whether it's a seminar onpostcolonial literature or a discussion on Shakespeare, I'm growing into someone who not onlyhas ideas—but can also voice them with confidence. Looking back, that first experience in 9th standard was more than just a school event—it wasthe beginning of discovering my voice. Public speaking, I've come to learn, isn't just aboutperfect grammar or flawless delivery. It's about connecting, expressing, and evolving. Today, whenever I see someone hesitating to speak, I think of that version of me-nervous, unsure, butbrave enough to step up. And I remind them, as I remind myself: The mic may amplify your voice, but it's your courage that makes it worth listening to.




